Mika snatches it back and grabs his backpack. "I have to see the Great Wizard. He is brewing me a new magical potion! Would you like to come?" The two of them nod.







The wizard nods. "Well done, Mika! Have you recorded it in your magic diary?"


Mika quickly rummages in his backpack. "Whoops! I completely forgot about that!"



Glossary: What different expressions mean

Mika is a special child = he lives with haemophilia



Haemophilia: This is a type of blood disease. In people with haemophilia, certain coagulation factors do not form in the blood, either at all, or in sufficient quantity. They therefore bleed for longer after an injury. Bleeding within the body can also happen spontaneously – in other words, without an external cause. People with haemophilia must therefore regularly inject themselves with a factor product, which contains the missing coagulation factor.

Magical potion = medicine = factor product




Factor product: This is the name of the medicine that children with haemophilia are regularly injected with. This prevents bleeding. The product also has to be injected if bleeding occurs suddenly, for example if the person falls over or develops a bump after falling over. In the book, the factor product is called the "magical potion".

Magic wand = syringe



Syringe: In the story of the little student wizard, the magic wand symbolically represents the syringe. This is used to give the medicine.

Mika's wound does not bleed for as long thanks to the magical potion = the blood coagulates more quickly



Coagulation: This is the process that takes place in the body to stop bleeding. This is necessary for wounds to heal.

Magic diary = patient diary



People with haemophilia must write down precisely when they have injected themselves with the factor product, recording how much of the product they have administered, the day and time, why they needed the medicine (due to an accident or as a regular dose for prevention purposes), what body part they injured (e.g. knee or elbow), and the number on the pack. It is important to write down all of this information for treatment by the doctor.





The history of little Mika imaginatively relates the adventure of a young student wizard with haemophilia. It explains to the reader how Mika stays calm in a difficult situation and why he has to have the Great Wizard regularly brew him a potion.
